












Child Abuse and Neglect Related Fatalities






Victims By Age


Removals by Region (2020)


Removal Rates by Region (2020)


4/10 Families Were Re-reported for Abuse/Neglect within 5 Years of Family Based Safety Services

Children in Substitute Care by Placement Type on 8/31/20




More Than 40% of Children in Substitute Care are Placed in a Kinship Home Across Most Regions (2020)


Sibling Groups Placed Together (2020)



DFPS Data Book - CPS Placements: Sibling Groups in Substitute Care Placed All Together on August 31




Out of County and Out of Region Placements



DFPS Data Book - CPS Foster Care Placements: Children (0-17) Placed in Originating County/Region on August 31




In 2020, More Kids Left Foster Care Than Entered


Exits from Substitute Care (2020)




Recurrence within 5 Years of Service for Children in Custody


Decreased Caseloads Increase Safety Outcomes for Kids



DFPS Data Book - Child Protective (CPI / CCI / CPS): Average Daily Caseload






Texas Prevention vs. Child Protection Budget (2021)

The Further Into the System a Case Flows, the More Expensive It Is.



Texas can expect to spend \$55 billion across the lifetime for confirmed cases of child abuse or neglect that occurred in 2019.





Preventing Child Abuse and Neglect

Prevention Spectrum

Primary

Primary prevention focuses on reaching families **before** the first occurrence of child maltreatment.

Secondary

Secondary
prevention focuses
on efforts to prevent
maltreatment
among families
considered to be at
high risk.

<u>Tertiary</u>

Tertiary prevention focuses on mitigating the negative effects and prevent re-occurrence in families where maltreatment has already occurred.

Intervening with families to meet their needs can occur at various times to prevent child maltreatment



Paths to Prevention

The early support of a caring adult can build a child's resiliency and prevent/mitigate the damaging effects of stress responses to ACEs.


